COMPREHENSIVE SOCIAL SERVICES

Lutheran Social Services of Nevada was founded in 1997 to address the growing needs of people seeking emergency food, housing and employment assistance in Nevada regardless of religious affiliation, age, or national origin. The agency has been recognized over the past 13 years as a major hunger-relief organization working to end food insecurity and increase access to nutritious food, housing and employment services for homeless, low, and



moderate income individuals. The agency has provided assistance to over 135,000 Nevadans in need – homeless families with dependent children, refugees and immigrants, troubled youths and families in crisis, seniors and homeless individuals. LSSN is accredited by the United Way of Southern Nevada and is also the primary agency used by Clark County for referrals to individuals in need of birth certificates and identification cards.

EMERGENCY FOOD PANTRY

The emergency food pantry allows clients to select fresh produce and packaged food items themselves in a supermarket-style setting free of charge. It combines this choice-style model with a specially designed selection of food in order to provide for the dietary needs of a diverse community.

Open four days a week – Mondays through Thursdays from 8 a.m. until 1 p.m., our food pantry helps provide more than 65,000 free and nutritious meals every month.

The majority of clients who benefit from the pantry receive food once every sixty days. Seniors and people with physical limitations are able to receive food once a month. Pantry bags are delivered by staff to homebound seniors and the physically disabled.

EMERGENCY RENTAL, UTILITY AND EMPLOYMENT SUPPORT

LSSN offers rental/utility, employment and other support services to homeless, low/moderate income clients. Hundreds of clients receive state identifications and certified birth certificates annually.



SUPPORTIVE HOUSING PROGRAM

The Supportive Housing Program, Project Returning Home, addresses the need for safe, secure, dignified housing with an emphasis on homeless families.

The program provides temporary housing to homeless families with minor children for up to 24 months. 1 bedroom/1 bathroom furnished apartments provide dignified housing.

Intensive case management is provided to all families to increase employment, self-sustainability and self-determination skills.

Formerly homeless clients graduate from the Supportive Housing Program and become independent and self-sustainable.
